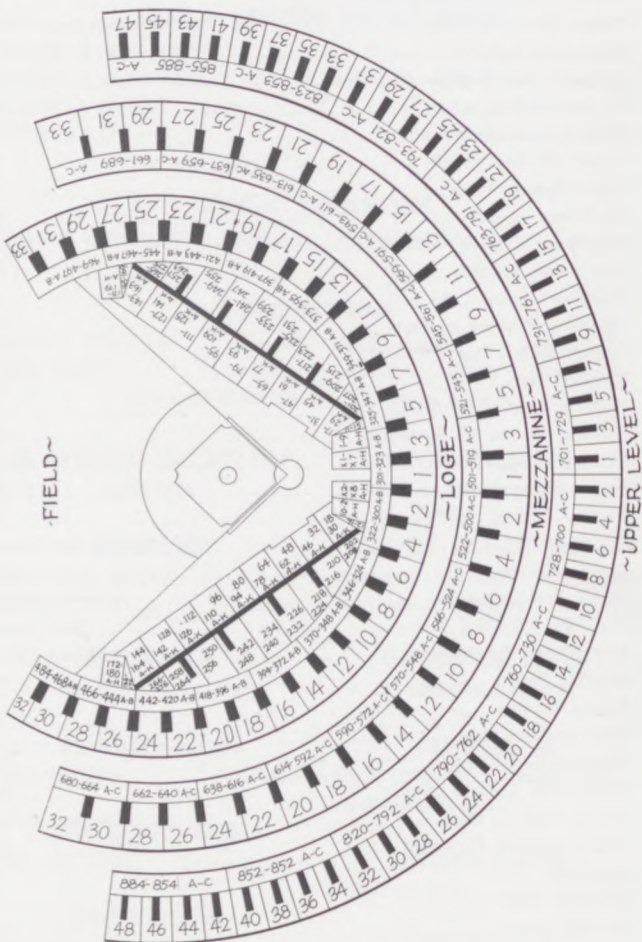

Mets won 19 and lost 48 under his command as he unselfishly made player development program No. 1 project. Results were underscored by emergence of Tug McGraw, Dick Selma and Darrell Sutherland as nucleus of prized young pitching staff.

Started season in dugout with Stengel and named pitching coach when Warren Spahn was released at All-Star break . . . Joined Mets' staff after 1963 season and handled first base coaching duties in 1964 . . . Coached with San Francisco (1958-63) after spending entire major league playing career (1947-1957) with New York Giants.

Set NL record for catchers with .999 fielding average (one error) in 1950. Had best year at plate in 1950 with 23 homers, and hit 20 more following year. Had three homers in one game, June 24, 1950.

Broke into organized ball in 1940 with Crookston (Minn.) of Northern League . . . Also played with Eau Claire, Little Rock and Minneapolis before entering service in May, 1943. After discharge he went to Jacksonville in 1946 and Minneapolis in 1947. After 1947 playoffs he joined Giants for six games and played entire 1948 season with New York. Farmed to Jersey City at start of 1949 but recalled after 51 games and has since been in majors as player, coach and manager.

Played on "Miracle of Coogan's Bluff" pennant winners of 1951 and '54 Giants' world champions who swept World Series from Cleveland . . . Member of 1952 and '53 All-Star squads although he didn't play in either game.

Was winning pitcher in two games in 1960 Pirate World Series triumph over Yankees. Started and won fifth game, 5-2, and was pitcher of record in seventh game when Bill Mazeroski homered for 10-9 triumph.

One of best fielding pitchers in game, he won three Golden Glove awards (1958-59-60) in National League . . . Nicknamed "Kitten" because of physical likeness to Harry "The Cat" Brecheen.

Sold by Orioles to Braves last Sept. 1, but refused to report because he felt he was not physically fit to help Braves, who were in thick of pennant fight . . . Agreed to become pitching coach of Kansas City's Vancouver farm club during Winter, but was released from commitment when opportunity opened to join Mets' staff and remain in major leagues.

Works his own farm during off-season . . . Plays guitar as hobby.
